Nice to meet our new members yesterday who you'll be hearing from in next month's edition.



## **LAKESIDE RING**

Back in October 2019 a concept sketch was produced by our Membership Officer (Carl Webb) for a Chapter ring. He promptly dropped it (like he does with most of his bikes), but then recovered and brought it to a Committee meeting to see if might be an interesting opportunity for Chapter members to show their support for the Chapter and their love of Harley Davidson Motorcycles.



Just a few weeks before lockdown the prototype was finished, (and is now firmly stuck on our Assistant Directors finger!!).





This prototype has been used to create a dye from which any number of duplicate rings can be produced. This unique piece of Chapter history is solid silver and each ring is cast as a one off piece by a professional jeweler and Silversmith.

The jeweler has cast 20 blanks ready for individual sizing.

The Chapter ring comes in two sizes. Bloody big and regular. The regular will cost you about £60. The bloody big, is about £120.

The jeweler, (Bill Murchie) has a shop in Ingatestone High Street, CM4 9EE.

## **Ride-out Guidelines**

Chapter activities are conducted primarily for the benefit of H.O.G. Chapter members. There are three categories of activities, identified as follows:

#### Member Event – (Rallies, Multi-day)

Member Events are events that are only open to Chapter Members or to other HOG Members with approval of a Chapter Primary Officer prior to the event date.

#### **Open Events**

Open Events are open to Chapter Members and others. *Guests must be approved by a Chapter Primary Officer prior to the event date.* 

#### Closed Events

Closed Events are open to Chapter members and one guest per member. *Riding guests will need approval of a Chapter Primary Officer prior to the event date.* 

#### **Chapter Primary Officers**

Director, Assistant Director, Treasurer, Secretary.

#### Guest Policy

Guests are allowed to participate in Member Events if they are a current HOG member and pre-approved by a Chapter Primary Officer.

An Open Event Guest is permitted at the discretion of one of the Chapter Primary Officers.

Each Chapter member is permitted to invite 1 guest, per event, to participate and may only have the same guest on 6 occasions in any membership year. If the event is subsidised then the guest will need to pay full cost.

Each guest must sign a Ride Disclaimer and the host Chapter member must take responsibility and must ensure that the guest abides by the Chapter rules.



## **MERCHANDISE**

The Chapter has a range of branded merchandise that is available for members to purchase via the Merchandising Officer at anytime on

The current Merchandising Officer is Neil Searle-Jones and merchandise is also available at Natter Nights and on some rides.

### SUGGESTED PATCH LAYOUT


The following photos show the suggested patch layout of principal patches on your cut (waistcoat).

## **ROAD CREW FIRST AID COURSE**

The Rules are that (if you want to do it by the book) you need to take a First Aid Course every 3 Years. I remember doing these with the FA, (Football Association) when I managed a youth football team and later when I qualified as a referee, and also with the AMA (Amateur Martial Arts association) when I qualified as a Karate Instructor. Other members of the Chapter have had First Aid Training within their respective professions, I know we have teachers, carers, and just about every type if industry professional (current and retired) in the Chapter who have at some time or another participated in



this type of Emergency First Aid training. It's amazing to see how the approach and the types of assistance given has changed and evolved over the years. There comes a time when you can't help but think 'I know this' but believe me when I say, 'no, you don't'.





The Chapter booked the Road Crew onto a course in Southend on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> February. Our (then) Safety Officer, **Mike Keogh** had arranged for us to do a course with Lazarus Training. It was a full day and the two instructors had tailored the course to accommodate injury more common to motorcycle incidents. No one wants to even think about being hurt while enjoying the Harley, the sunshine and the open road, so I'm not going to go into gory details. We dealt with the obvious First Aid situations, CPR, choking, heart attack, bleeding, stroke and a multitude of really simple procedures by which to ensure any patient would stand the best chance to survive and recover. This, of course, was reinforced with copious amounts of humour and micky taking, but never detracted from the seriousness of what we were being taught.

One of the Lazarus team was responsible for the instruction, the other was our 'victim'. It's amazing how the pressure of a training scenario is exponentially increased when a woman is lying on the floor, coughing up (fake) blood. There were several other play acting situations that we were asked to deal with during the day and the fact that you were dealing with a real person brought home the smallest sense of urgency and pressure of the situation.





The overall opinion from the Road Crew was that this was probably one of the best First Aid courses they'd ever been on. There are plans to book Lazarus again for a Chapter course for any members who want to participate.

While no one likes to think about an accident ever happening, it's good to know that there will be at least two people riding with you who have been trained to deal with the worst. Here's to hoping we never, ever, ever need them.



We all then met up with Amy on the Harley stand and talked everything H.O.G.


Phill and myself then spent an hour trying to get our old Head Road captain's (Grant) bike started but to no avail, should have stuck with Harley mate instead of BMW lol.






There are various channels of communication regarding ride-outs and upcoming trips, either local or abroad - Pondlife, the Chapter Website, Facebook and TeamUp.


