BIKER SAFETY WHEN COLD

So yes, the winter is here....

When riding in cold weather, it's crucial to prioritise safety by ensuring proper gear and awareness of the conditions.



HOW COLD IS TOO COLD FOR MOTORCYCLE RIDING?

Riding a motorcycle gives you that top-of-the-world vibe, doesn't it? Yet, hold your horses, because when temperatures plummet, that joyful liberty can turn into a frosty adventure quicker than you think. Being an enthusiast of the two-wheel journey, I'm sure you frequently ponder, "When does it get too cold for a bike ride?" This query is far from just a matter of staying cozy; it's crucial since braving the cold on the Harley isn't just a downer—it can be downright dangerous.

When the mercury dips, the risks increase. Cold weather affects both your body and your bike, making it essential to know your limits and prepare accordingly. Let's explore the factors that determine when it's too cold to ride and offer some tips to stay safe and warm on the road.





- Cold weather can significantly affect both the rider's comfort and motorcycle performance, making it essential to assess whether it's too cold to ride.
- Wind chill and personal tolerance levels are critical factors in determining safe riding temperatures, with wind chill substantially reducing perceived temperature at higher speeds.
- Insulated motorcycle clothing and protective accessories, such as heated gloves and vests, are crucial for maintaining warmth and safety during cold weather riding.

- Pre-ride preparations, including checking tire tread, battery health, and layering appropriate gear, are vital for safe motorcycle riding in low temperatures.
- Adjusting your riding style for reduced traction and being mindful of weather conditions like wind chill and precipitation can help prevent accidents and enhance overall safety.

FACTORS AFFECTING RIDING COMFORT

Several factors affect riding comfort in cold weather. Wind chill significantly reduces perceived temperature, especially at higher speeds. For instance, a 40°F day can feel like 25°F when riding at 60 mph. Clothing choice, including insulated gear, windproof layers, and heated apparel, plays a crucial role. Additionally, the type of motorcycle, such as those with windshields and fairings, can provide extra protection from the cold. Proper maintenance of the bike ensures reliable operation in low temperatures, avoiding issues with cold starts and battery failures.

IMPORTANCE OF PERSONAL TOLERANCE LEVELS

Personal tolerance levels vary for each rider. Some can comfortably ride in 40°F weather, while others struggle below 60°F. It's essential to know your limits and recognise signs of hypothermia, which include shivering, numbness, and impaired judgment. If you feel discomfort, it's safer to end your ride early. Experienced riders might stretch their limits with proper gear, but it's crucial to prioritise safety over endurance. Assessing your cold tolerance through short rides can help determine your comfort range.

ESSENTIAL GEAR FOR COLD WEATHER RIDING

Insulated Motorcycle Clothing

To stay warm in cold weather, it's important to wear insulated motorcycle clothing. Insulated jackets and pants provide the necessary warmth to combat freezing temperatures. Look for gear made with thermal liners and waterproof materials for added protection. Layering thermal shirts and leggings under your riding gear can also help. I think the old saying "you get what you pay for" is essential to remember when buying warm, insulated clothing.



Protective Accessories



Protective accessories are crucial for maintaining warmth and safety. Heated gloves and grips keep your hands warm. Battery-operated heated vests and liners add an extra layer of comfort. Balaclavas and neck warmers shield your face and neck from cold wind. In severe conditions, consider using a full-face helmet with a breath guard to prevent fogging and retain heat.

Fantastic feedback by all who attended, an LOH event that must be repeated next year...2026! Thank you to all that attended.













I wish you all a Christmas wrapped in peace, tied with love, and filled with joy that lasts all year.




A Very Merry Christmas from your Events Team.


Once the quiz had been completed, and the answers shared, Vince Knight was announced the winner, with four-chapter members receiving the wooden spoon.


The afternoon was complete with the whole Chapter singing Happy Birthday to Beryl who was celebrating her 92nd Birthday.





Chapter activities are conducted primarily for the benefit of H.O.G. Chapter members.

Ride Guest Policy

An Event Guest is permitted at the discretion of one of the Chapter Road Captains.

A Chapter member is permitted to invite one guest per event, to participate and may only have the same guest on six occasions in any membership year. If the event is subsidised then the guest will need to pay full cost.

Each guest must sign a Ride Disclaimer and the host Chapter member must take responsibility and must ensure that the guest abides by the Chapter rules.



There are various channels of communication regarding ride-outs and upcoming trips, either local or abroad - Pondlife, the Chapter Website, Facebook and Google Calendar.

At times, due to circumstances beyond our control, rides may be cancelled/changed/postponed at very short notice.

If requests are made for you to show your interest in a particular event, please only do so via the requested means and please do so within the time frame requested. This is very important and will enable the road captains to accurately and efficiently plan the upcoming ride/event





We have a number of meeting places from which the Chapter begins its Ride Outs. The usual start points are as follows:

LAKESIDE CHAPTER RIDE AWARDS

Lakeside Chapter operates a **Ride Out Awards Program** based on the number of Official Chapter Rides each Member attends. You must ensure you 'Sign-In' with the Road Captain each time you attend a Ride Out. This helps the RC know the number of Members on each Ride and will be recorded by the Chapter Historian on the Ride Awards Spreadsheet (displayed on the next Page).

Multi-day Rides and Rally's may count for more than one Ride Award. Check with the RC for this.

Ride Award Pin Badges will usually be awarded at Natter Nights for 10, 25, 50, 75, 100 (and so on) for completed Rides.

There is an All Time Total Ride Award Page and a Total Number of Rides completed (so far) this year so you can track your progress.
